

The Heller School Journal of Social Policy Author Submission Guidelines

The Heller School Journal of Social Policy is a student-run, scholarly journal aimed at furthering the Heller School's mission of "knowledge advancing social justice." As such, the journal publishes high-quality policy research and analysis addressing current social policy issues, particularly in the areas of health, behavioral health, aging, children, youth, and families, and poverty alleviation. The journal both contributes to academic discussions and aids practitioners and policymakers working to promote social justice.

The Journal is now accepting submissions for the inaugural issue. Submissions by one or more authors are welcome, and are due by March 1, 2009. Submissions should:

- Address contemporary social policy issues, which may include, but are not limited to, health, behavioral health, aging, children, youth, and families, and poverty alleviation.
- Be original and unpublished (class assignments are fine).
- Be of an academic nature, but may also take the form of op-eds, book or film reviews, or interview transcripts.
- Be less than 5000 words.

All submissions must meet the following style criteria. Failure to comply will be grounds for immediate rejection.

- Double-spaced, 12 point Times New Roman font.
- Use citations in the Chicago style.
- Have a title on the first page.
- Include an abstract of 200 or fewer words.
- Submitted as a Word document in ".doc" format.
- The author's name should be omitted from all pages; it should appear only in the email accompanying submission.
- Submitted to hsjsp_submissions@lists.brandeis.edu with the words "journal submission" in the subject line.

Please note: by submitting an article/interview/book or film review, the author agrees to cooperate with the Journal Review Board in fact-checking and editing. The author also agrees to abide by The Heller School Journal of Social Policy copyright requirements and limitations.
