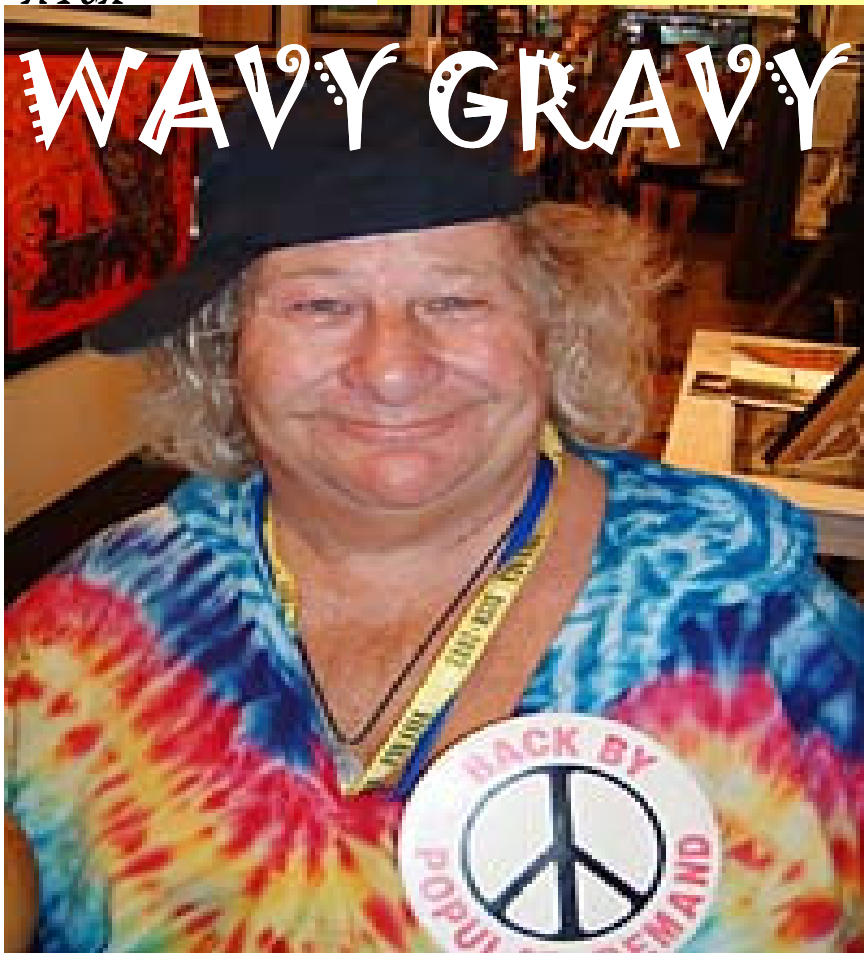

He directs Camp Winnarainbow, a performing arts program for children and organizes all-star rock concerts to raise money for a variety of environmental, progressive, political, and charitable causes; most notably Seva, a foundation he co-founded in 1978. Seva serves people around the world who are struggling for health, cultural survival, and sustainable communities.
