Faculty, alumni, staff, friends, and admirers of Dr. Shonkoff's work in child, youth, and family social policy, established the Jack Shonkoff Fellowship in Child and Family Policy in 2005. Donors made an investment in the education of students dedicated to the values that have driven Jack's career and who will make a significant contribution to the field of child and family policy.

Dr. Jack Shonkoff was Dean of the Heller School for Social Policy and Management and the Samuel F. and Rose B. Gingold Professor of Human Development and Social Policy at Brandeis from 1994 until 2005. In 1996, he was appointed chair of the Board on Children, Youth, and Families at the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences. Currently, he is the Julius B Richmond FAMRI Professor of Child Health and Development at the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health and at the Harvard Graduate School of Education. In addition, Dr. Shonkoff is a Professor of Pediatrics at Harvard Medical School and at Boston Children's Hospital. He is also the Founding Director of the university-wide Center on the Developing Child at Harvard.
