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# Principles from 2008

- Purpose of health reform is to improve health and redesign care to improve value (quality/costs) so access is maintained and improved
- Aim for market-wide implementation, not just for Medicaid
- Seek - and expect – unprecedented public and private collaboration
- Use the Triple Aim as a guiding framework

# Health Reform 2008 - 2010

- Statewide Health Improvement Program (SHIP)
- Transparency
  - Statewide Quality Measurement
  - Provider Peer Grouping on Quality and Costs
- Payment Reform
  - Health Care Homes
  - Accountable care in Medicaid
- Workforce issues
- Consumer engagement

# Payment Reform 2008 - 2012

- “Total Cost of Care” (TCOC) reforms
  - Unsuccessful 2008; resurrected 2010 for Medicaid
    - 2012 Medicaid “Health Care Delivery Systems Demonstration;” 9 “accountable care” proposals - voluntary
  - Private market rapidly moving to “TCOC contracts”
- Health care homes
  - Medicaid, health plans, Medicare demonstration
- Baskets of care (or episodes of care)
  - Defined in 2009; used for measurement and QI but not significantly for payment reform in Medicaid or the private market

- 2010 MN Department of Health report
- 2012 “Citizen Solutions” for health reform
  - Citizens’ League Initiative – funded by Bush Foundation
    - Report to be used by Governor’s Task Force
