
## Current Hospital Model Features (2014-2018)

- ✓ Per capita, value-based payment framework for hospitals
- ✓ Provider-led efforts to reduce avoidable use, and improve quality and coordination
- ✓ Savings to Medicare without cost shifting
- ✓ Sustains rural health care with stable revenue base

## Future Model Features (2019 and beyond)


- ✓ Complex and chronic care improvement, population health
- ✓ Provider-led innovations in primary care, nursing homes, other care settings, fostering State innovation and flexibility
- ✓ Limit growth in Medicare Total Cost of Care (A&B) for 800k FFS benes

## Medicare savings of \$500+ million in hospital payments in 3 years, relative to national growth rates




