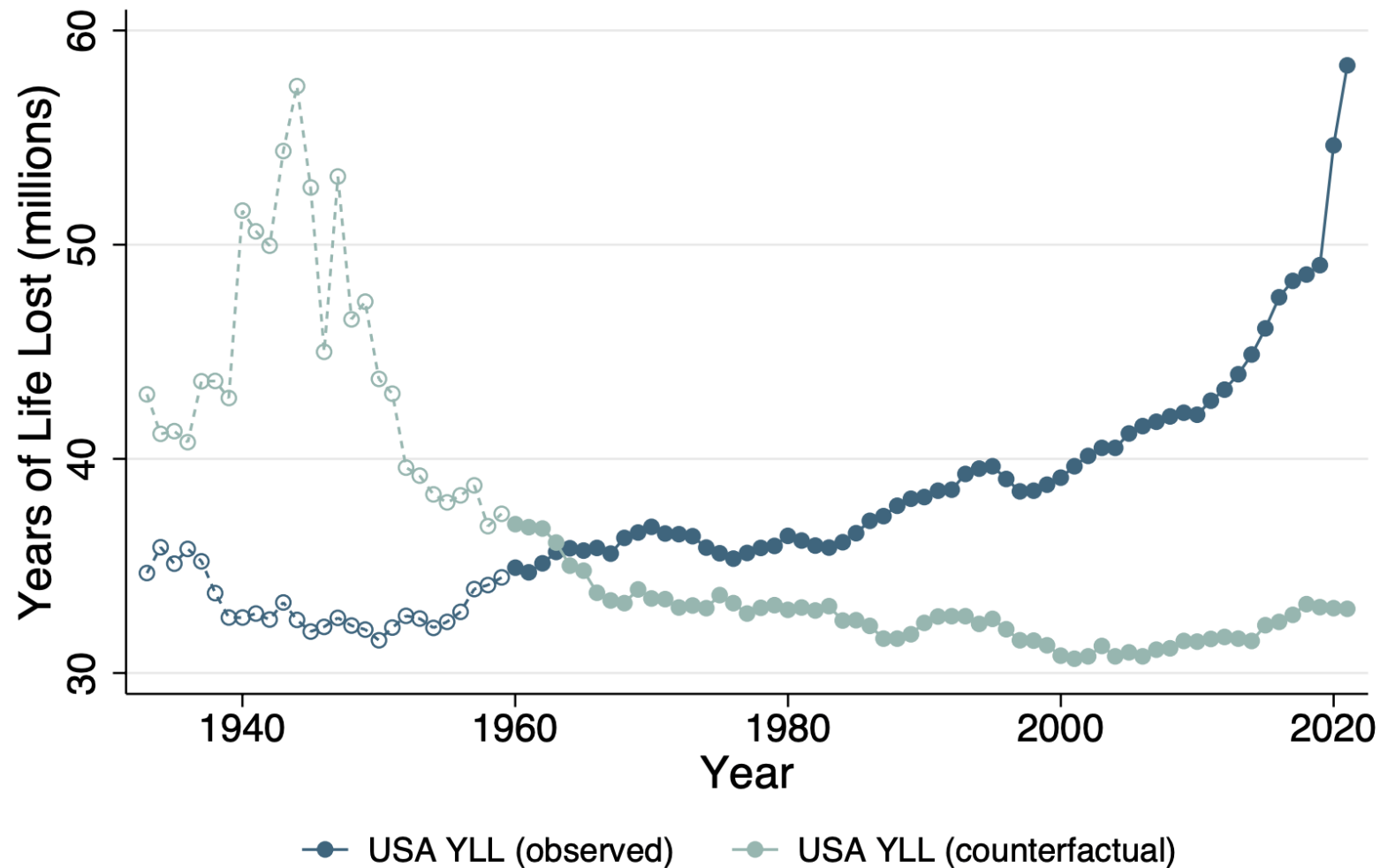

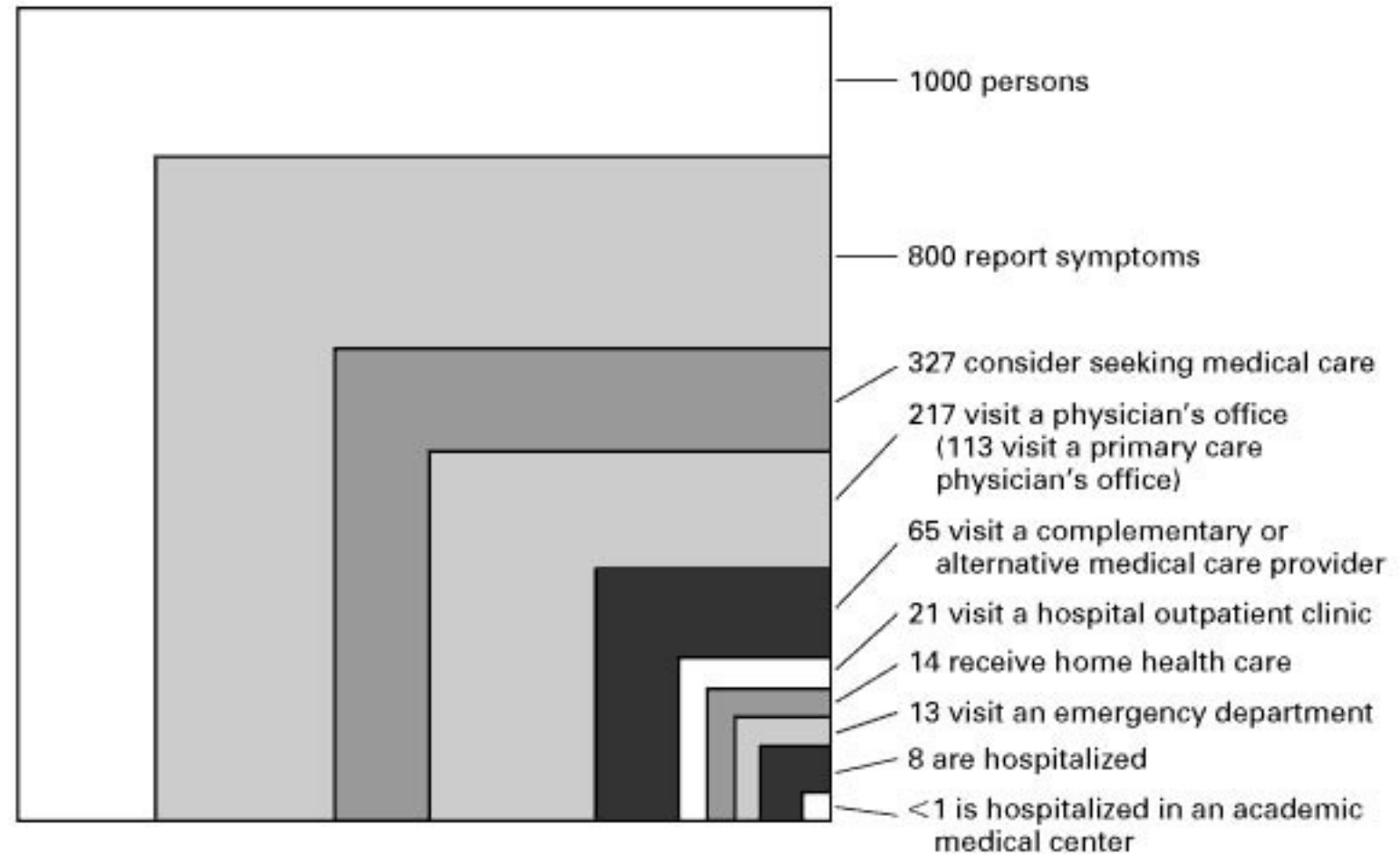

Reimagining care through CHW- powered regional hubs: Washington state's vanguard model

Washington state's model for integrating Community Health Workers' (CHWs) into clinical and community-based settings stands out nationally. Born from partnership between the state's public health and health care agencies, the Community Care Hubs refer community members to local resources while promoting continuity of care across the state.

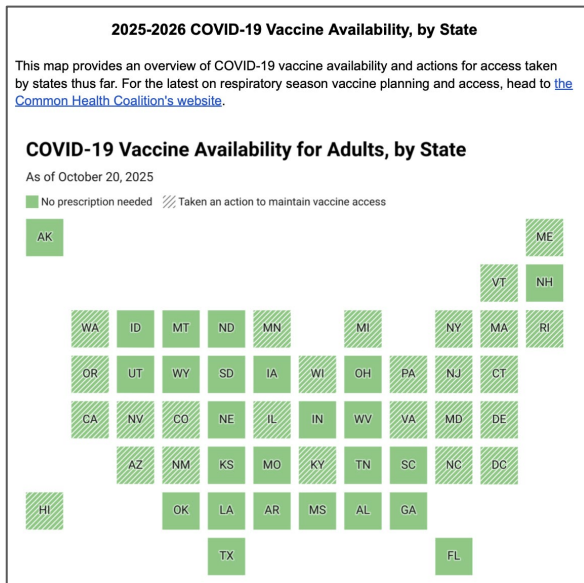
From clinical pilot to community infrastructure, thanks to health system partnerships

Washington's Community Care Hubs allow CHWs to connect people to the health care and social services they need. This system rests on a web of interdependent roles and braided funding from across the health sector.

This table provides an aggregate summary of updated recommendations from various sources for flu, RSV, and COVID-19 vaccines for infants and children, pregnant people, adults 18-50, and adults 50+ based on the latest guidelines from specialty societies. 	Influenza Vaccine	RSV Immunization	COVID-19 Vaccine
Infants and Children	All children 6 months and older Some children 6 months to 8 years may need multiple doses ACOG, AAP, CDC	All infants <8 months + children 8-19 months with risk factors (nirsevimab, clesrovimab), typically Oct-Mar, if no maternal RSV vaccine AAP, AAP, CDC	All children 6-23 months + children 2-18 years with risk factors or if parent desires vaccine AAP, AAP, AAP
Pregnancy	All At any point in pregnancy ACOG, AAP, CDC	32-36 weeks gestation (Pfizer, Abrysvo only) Typically Sept-Jan ACOG, AAP, CDC	All At any point in pregnancy ACOG, AAP
Adults 18-50	All AAP, CDC	See Pregnancy AAP, CDC	All Especially important for people with risk factors or who have never received a vaccine AAP, IDSA
Adults 50+	All High-dose, recombinant or adjuvanted flu vaccine preferred for 65+ if available AAP, CDC	All 75+ and adults 50-74 with risk factors One lifetime dose of RSV vaccine AAP, CDC	All Especially important for people with risk factors or who have never received a vaccine AAP, IDSA

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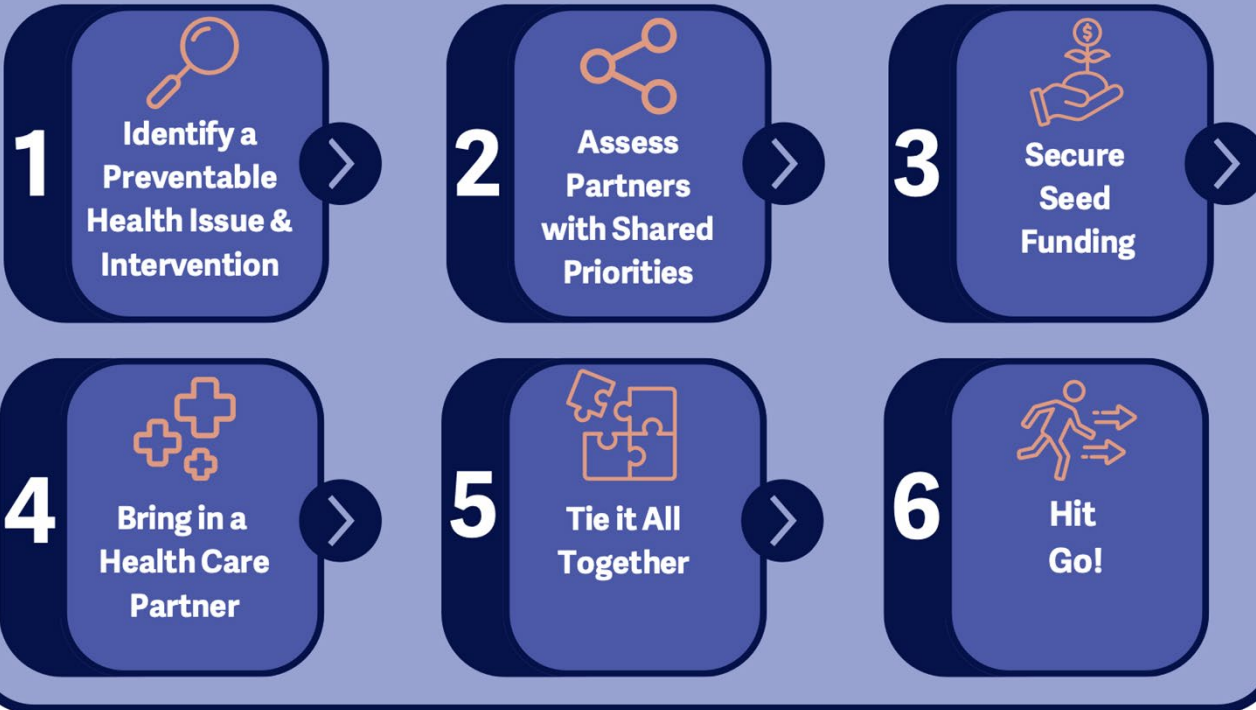




Creative funding models
