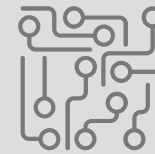
Through innovative grant-making, partnerships, and research, the Center works to identify and promote promising solutions to improve healthcare affordability.

Build state capacity to monitor healthcare spending and implement policies that address rising healthcare costs



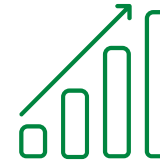
Data Transparency

Accelerate healthcare innovation and adoption of high-value health technologies

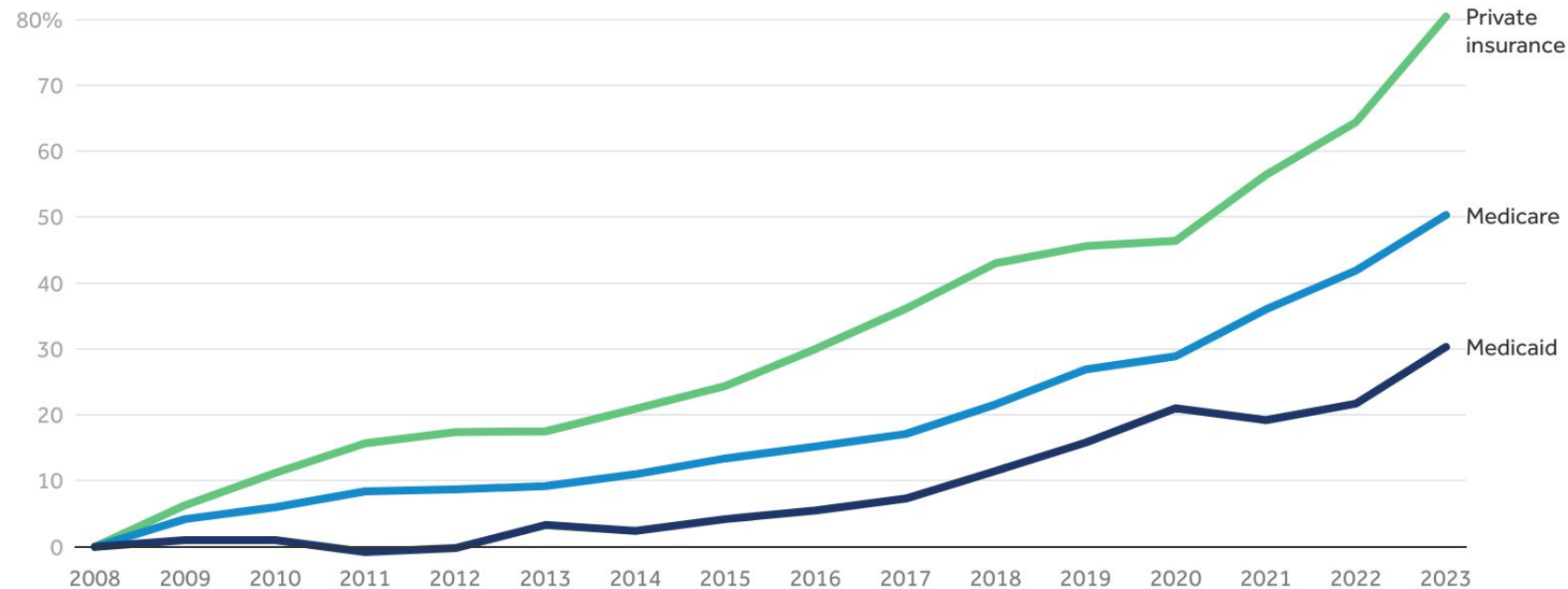


Tracking System Performance
