


Our 174 Lifelong Segal Fellows:

Micky O'Neill is the 2025 Segal Fellow working in the office of the AmeriCorps' CEO, after serving two years as an AmeriCorps Tutor with Literacy First in Austin, Texas. He is the 14th AmeriCorps alum to hold this Fellowship at AmeriCorps' agency headquarters in DC, where these Segal leaders have worked with multiple CEOs, appointed across 4 Presidents. This partnership continues to cement our deep ties to national service, honoring Eli and Phyllis' legacies.

While navigating efforts to downsize the agency this spring and across the longest Federal Government shutdown, Micky has remained passionate, adaptable, hopeful, and impactful. During the staffing cuts earlier this year, he was supporting everything from government relations, to human capital, to the mailroom, and beyond. This is both an incredible leadership experience for him and an important service for our country.

As Micky shared, "From being a service member, to suddenly helping steer the whole AmeriCorps enterprise amid swift changes, has been a source of huge growth for me. Since I care about AmeriCorps, I'm always happy to dive in and do what is needed." He's most proud of highlighting the work of AmeriCorps' participants and partners for Congress and of connecting with the community on agency visits to program sites. He is one of the scores of Segal Fellows who are leaning in and staying strong as public servants during these turbulent times.
