SPRING SEMESTER COHORT MEETINGS

The 2022 Brandeis Segal Fellows will meet as a cohort approximately 7 times between January and April 2022 (excluding holidays and vacations) in order to participate in the Segal Citizen Leadership development program and to develop relationships with the other Fellows. (If the cohort is only available for 1-hour long meetings, then meetings will be approximately weekly, instead of every other week, and would be more frequent.) In order to apply to the Program, you must be able to attend these meetings. Fellows studying abroad or virtually can participate virtually but may need to participate in the early morning or late evening, due to time differences. When possible, the meetings take place on a regular biweekly afternoon or lunchtime weekday during the spring semester, based on participants schedules.

Selected Fellows will also be asked to attend a brief welcome celebration and orientation in mid-December or early January for 1.5-2 hours.

If Fellows are studying abroad or virtually in spring or fall 2022, they will need to be willing and able to make space in their schedules to participate in cohort meetings virtually.
