Anthony Afriyie (2021 AmeriCorps Alums Segal Fellow)

As an undergraduate, Lindsey was a Bystander Intervention Intern at Shaw Wellness Institute, where she worked to promote active bystander behavior in dangerous situations, including sexual assault, harassment & discrimination, and drug & alcohol abuse. She also interned at Unitas,

which is a non-profit organization dedicated to preventing human trafficking and providing opportunities for survivors to thrive. Through her work in public health, Lindsey has become passionate about prevention and health promotion, with an emphasis on social determinants of health and community resilience.
